## COMMITMENT TO COMMUNITY SUSTAINABILITY

**INPEX and its Ichthys Project joint venture participant Total have committed \$3 million to the construction of a trade training centre to be built by the Larrakia Development Corporation in Darwin.**

In making the donation, INPEX and Total recognise the Larrakia people as the Traditional Owners of the land and waters of the Greater Darwin Region, including Blaydin Point where the Ichthys LNG Plant and its associated onshore facilities are planned to be located.

The Larrakia Trade Training Centre (the Centre) will provide training and facilitate employment opportunities for youth from all sectors of the community including Larrakia, other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and the wider community.

The Centre is being developed by the Larrakia Development Corporation (LDC) working in strategic alliance with Advanced Training International (training provider) and Kormilda College (education provider).

The Centre will be constructed on a 1.2 hectare site owned by the LDC within the Darwin Business Park at East Arm.

The Centre will help to achieve greater economically and socially sustainable outcomes for the community. An important aim of the Centre is to create a pool of skilled workers needed in remote Aboriginal communities in the Northern Territory.

The purpose-built facility is being designed to develop the skills of young people in industrial trades where there are employment opportunities. The Centre will include a specialist trades workshop, classrooms and other supporting facilities.

The Centre, which is expected to open in September 2010, will initially provide accredited qualifications in the following areas:

- Electrical
- Refrigeration
- Automotive mechanics
- Metal fabrication
- Plumbing

In addition, the Centre will be a culturally-sensitive learning environment offering:

- Literacy and numeracy courses
- Work-ready skills and transition support
- Job placement assistance and career counselling
- Links to counselling services for students and youth
- Opportunities for further education

INPEX and the LDC have established a close working relationship and have already collaborated on a number of

activities in support of the Ichthys Project. These include the development of heritage management plans for Blaydin Point where the LNG plant would be located, and for the Howard Springs site of the planned Accommodation Village for the construction workforce.

The donation to enable the construction of the Centre follows the November 2009 signing of a Memorandum of Understanding between the Larrakia Development Corporation and INPEX to identify and, where practical, seek employment, training and business opportunities for the Larrakia, including on the Ichthys Project itself.

A cornerstone of the Ichthys Project joint venture's operating philosophy is to contribute to the host communities in which we operate. Through the Larrakia Trade Training Centre, the Ichthys Project will make an important contribution to the social and economic sustainability of the Darwin community.

## About the Ichthys Project

The Ichthys Project is a Joint Venture between INPEX (76%, the Operator) and Total (24%). Gas from the Ichthys Field, in the Browse Basin off the Western Australian coast, will undergo preliminary processing offshore to remove water and raw liquids, including condensate.

The gas will then be exported to onshore processing facilities in Darwin via an 885km subsea pipeline. The Ichthys Project is expected to produce 8.4 million tonnes of LNG and approximately 1.6 million tonnes of LPG per annum, along with 100,000 barrels of condensate per day at peak.



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
