

This week JKC advises that construction activities at our work sites will include:

Blaydin Point

- Heavy rock transport by 10 road trains daily from DAC Howard West quarry (Yarrawonga) via Stuart Highway and Jenkins Road to Blaydin Point
- Small rock transport by eight road trains daily from Yebna quarry via Stuart Highway and Jenkins Road to site
- Two road trains daily transporting crushed rock from Mt Bunday quarry to the concrete batching plant on Channel Island Road
- Twelve road trains daily transporting crushed rock from Mt Bunday quarry to site
- Four concrete trucks daily transporting concrete from a batching plant on Channel Island Road to site
- Ongoing ground improvements for the Module Offloading Facility (MOF) causeway and setting of stone columns from the shore side towards the harbour
- Operation of two shifts working 10 hours per shift, with maintenance performed between each shift
- From 2 March five road trains daily transporting poly pipe and fittings from interstate via Stuart Highway and Jenkins Road
- From 15 March five road trains daily transporting piles from East Arm Port along Wishart Road, Elrundie Avenue and Channel Island Road to site
- From 13 April one road train daily transporting cable drums from interstate via Stuart Highway and Jenkins Road to site
- From 7 March three trucks daily transporting office modules 3.3 x 14.4 meters no escort required from East Arm Port along Wishart Road, Elrundie Avenue and Channel Island Road to site
- Chung Wah Terrace upgrade is now complete and street lights are now in operation without the need for generator power

Howard Springs Accommodation Village

- Replacing the temporary fence with permanent stock fence along the perimeter of the site starting on the southern end of Stow Road, continuing until the end of March
- Ongoing construction of the sewerage headworks linking with Palmerston sewerage system including work on Lambrick Avenue near Zuccoli
- Installation of low voltage power lines along perimeter of site on Stow Road by Power and Water Corporation. This activity will take approximately two weeks to complete
- Traffic control in place on Lambrick Avenue is ongoing as part of pump station works
- Small rock and fill transport by two road trains daily from Howard Springs quarry along Gunn Point Road and Howard Springs Road to site
- Small rock fill transport by two road trains daily from Mt Bunday quarry along Arnhem Highway, Stuart Highway and Howard Springs Road to site
- Six concrete trucks daily travelling from Winnellie batching plant along Tiger Brennan Drive, Stuart Highway and Howard Springs Road to site
- All other ongoing site preparation and construction activities will be conducted from 7am to 6pm with some Sunday work inside building

Regular patrols of the Howard Springs Accommodation Village (internal and external) are ongoing to ensure safety and security. If you see anything suspicious in the vicinity of the site please contact the Community Relations Team on the JKC Community Feedback line 1300 724 795

Appropriate dust suppression and street sweeping measures are in place at all JKC construction sites. All truck rock loads are covered. Noise, dust and road conditions will continue to be monitored.
