



## **FEBRUARY 2019 UPDATE – INPEX LARRAKIA ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

### **INPEX Larrakia Advisory Committee and community benefits trust**

INPEX as the operator of Ichthys LNG in Darwin has established a community benefits trust with the Larrakia Traditional Owners in the Northern Territory.

The Larrakia community benefits trust is funded by INPEX and the Ichthys LNG Joint Venture participants in recognition that Ichthys LNG onshore production facilities at Bladin Point were constructed and are hosted on Larrakia traditional lands.

The Larrakia community benefits trust will receive applications and will be supported by an independent trustee, who will oversee the management and distribution of the funds.

### **Ichthys LNG - update**

Ichthys LNG is a large energy development that involves offshore gas processing facilities, and an 890 kilometre pipeline to transport gas and oil to a liquefied natural gas processing plant in Darwin at Bladin Point.

### **INPEX Larrakia Advisory Committee**

The INPEX Larrakia Advisory Committee has been established by INPEX to form an open two-way dialogue with the Larrakia community and INPEX. The committee consists of Larrakia men and women, who provide advice to the Company across a range of social and economic initiatives.

INPEX chose the committee members, based on their personal skills and backgrounds as business operators, academic or people with social and cultural expertise.

A representative from both the Larrakia Development Corporation and the Larrakia Nation Aboriginal Corporation are members of the committee.

The INPEX Larrakia Advisory Committee shares its thoughts with INPEX on Ichthys LNG and discusses economic, cultural, environment and social areas of interest and opportunity for Larrakia families.

Further, this committee acts as a conduit for information flow between Larrakia families and the Company. Following careful consideration of the diverse backgrounds, employment histories and the availability of Larrakia members to participate, INPEX selected the following members:

- **Bill Risk** - Senior Larrakia Elder with extensive heritage knowledge. Mr Risk has previously participated on the LDC/LHMEC, where he demonstrated leadership and was respected by other Larrakia members. Mr Risk is a former Executive Member of the Northern Land Council, representing Darwin and has previously been involved in negotiating a number of agreements for Larrakia people regarding Native Title. Mr Risk is a board member of the Kenbi reference committee, Chair of Imparja television, a board member of the Darwin Daly Wagait Land Trust and a board member of the Larrakia Nation Aboriginal Corporation. Mr Risk is a Larrakia Business Owner and has won numerous contracts in the Northern Territory. Mr Risk has also provided Welcomes to Country for President Obama, the Prince of Wales and numerous other dignitaries.
- **Darryn Wilson** - Mr Wilson is a Heritage lecturer with Batchelor Institute, based at Charles Darwin University. He is responsible for the delivery of heritage, governance and advocacy units within the Indigenous knowledge portfolio. Darryn has experience in land management consultation issues and has worked in several remote locations around the Territory. Darryn was a board member and previous chairperson of the Larrakia Nation Aboriginal Corporation and strongly believes that a more holistic approach to Larrakia matters is timely and by far the best approach in moving forward.
- **Jeanneen McLennan** – Ms McLennan is a Larrakia and Guringi woman, who also has Chinese, Scottish and Irish heritage. She was born in Darwin during the year of Cyclone Tracy and is a single mother. She has worked within the Youth Work and Community Sectors for over 25 years, during which time she has volunteered for several not for profit organisations. Jeanneen has also been a member of several community organisation boards, including the Larrakia Nation Aboriginal Corporation, Danila Dilba Health Service and Chairperson of the Northern Territory Stolen Generation. Jeanneen provides Welcomes to Country and has done so for many years.
- **Chrissy Jenner** – Ms Jenner has over 28 years' experience in the Public Service, which has required her to travel and work with many Aboriginal communities and people throughout the Northern Territory. Currently working in Indigenous Affairs, Chrissy brings a solid background in governance, procurement, management and employment.
- **Phyllis Mitchell** – Ms Mitchell has been an advisory board member of both Larrakia Development Corporation and the Larrakia Nation Aboriginal Corporation. Ms Mitchell has also served as a Larrakia representative for the Board of Directors of Danila Dilba Medical Centre. Ms Mitchell has worked for 36 years in the Northern Territory including finance, contracts, the legislative assembly and managing the Aboriginal Interpretive service team.

- **Justine Williams** – Ms Williams works as the Community Relations Manager with CareFlight Northern Operations. She has previously worked for over 10 years with Larrakia Nation Aboriginal Corporation, in a range of roles including administration and land care. She volunteers for her local sporting club and is involved in the roll out of CareFlight's Reconciliation Action Plan.
- **Carol Quill** - Ms Quill is a qualified teacher who specialises in how babies and children acquire language. She predominately works with low literacy students including Refugees and Asylum Seekers and has also trained in Autism support. She is currently taking leave from teaching to care for her elderly Larrakia mother. Ms Quill is a member of the Roman-Danks family.
- **Mark Motlop** - Mr Motlop, joined the LDC Board in 2010, was appointed Deputy Chair in 2011 and Chair in 2013. He has worked in numerous professional roles in the NT Government Department of Business, Economic and Regional Development, the AFLNT, YWCA and the Juvenile Justice Diversionary Program. He has a Diploma of Business from Charles Darwin University (CDU) and is near completing a Bachelor of Commerce (CDU). Other professional appointments include Chairperson of the Northern Territory Indigenous Education Council, a role he held since its inception in 2007, Chairperson of MAJIMAP Choice Aboriginal Corporation from 2003 to 2009 and Deputy Chairperson of the Northern Territory Indigenous Affairs Advisory Council from 2009 to 2012. Mr Motlop is the Larrakia Development Corporation representative on the committee.
- **Pauline Baban** – Mrs Baban is a Larrakia woman who is a long-standing member of the Larrakia Nation Aboriginal Corporation. Mrs Baban is the representative for Larrakia Nation Aboriginal Corporation on the committee.
- **Bill Townsend (INPEX representative)** - Mr Townsend is General Manager External Affairs and Joint Venture at INPEX where he manages the Company's government and community relations, corporate social responsibility, Aboriginal affairs, regulatory approvals, communications, media relations and joint venture management. Bill has a BA (Political Science) from Northwestern University and an MBA from Dartmouth College. Bill is Chairman of the American Chamber of Commerce (AmCham) in Western Australia and a Director on the national AmCham board.
- **Irene Stainton (INPEX representative)** - Ms Stainton is the Manager Aboriginal Affairs, where she manages the Company's Aboriginal stakeholder engagements in Darwin, the Kimberley and Perth, as well as Heritage Management and is responsible for the delivery of the company's commitment to Reconciliation Action. Irene has a BA Aboriginal Community Management and Development from Curtin University. Irene is a member of the Board of Trustees of the WA Museum, Chairperson of the WA Museum's Aboriginal Advisory Committee and Chairperson of the National Trust of WA's Aboriginal Advisory Committee.

### Updates

To date, the INPEX Larrakia Advisory Committee has held 16 meetings, over 2016, 2017 and 2018.

The meetings have provided the opportunity to establish the Committee, discuss potential Larrakia benefits associated with the trust and have provided detailed advice on the development of policies and procedures.
