## Ichthys LNG: supporting energy security and economic benefits

It was another busy year for INPEX and the Ichthys joint venture in 2023. The safe departure of our 1000th cargo from Ichthys LNG in December 2023 was a proud moment: with each cargo supporting Indo-Pacific energy security, while helping deliver positive outcomes for Northern Territory communities, through jobs, training and social and economic benefits. This milestone would not have been possible without the ongoing support of our business, community and government stakeholders here in the Territory – and of course, our people and their families.

## Our pathway to net zero

INPEX is actively focused on supporting the world's growing demand for reliable, affordable and clean energy. As mapped out in our INPEX Vision@2022, we are working hard to help reshape the Australian energy landscape by decarbonising our upstream operations and investing in renewables and the next generation clean fuels. Natural gas will continue to play a critical role in the global energy mix in 2050 and beyond. Importantly though, it will be decarbonised.

As we move towards net-zero emissions by 2050, the Territory remains a focal point for INPEX and will play a critical role in the company's decarbonisation strategy. We are aiming to introduce carbon capture and storage (or CCS) to Ichthys LNG in the late-2020s, and our multi-year appraisal program through the INPEX-led Bonaparte CCS joint venture is now underway, after extensive consultation and regulatory approval.

We are proud to be doing our part to help deliver Australia's net zero goals and support a carbon-neutral future. In a significant investment to advance our non-hydrocarbon business, INPEX is now a 50% owner of renewables company Enel Green Power Australia. This means INPEX is now firmly on the path to achieving gigawatt scale renewable energy power generation by 2030 – leveraging Australia's abundant solar and wind resources.

## We're listening

As a business, we value trusted relationships, so in 2023 we reached out to the Darwin community and local stakeholders to see how we were tracking. A community perception survey was led and implemented by independent consultants and achieved more than 200 digital survey responses and interviews with around 40 stakeholders from a range of sectors. Some key highlights from the survey included the majority of respondents agreeing or strongly agreeing that INPEX:

- has a strong presence in the community;
- contributes to the NT economy; and
- creates value for communities.

We would like to thank everyone who took the time to provide this valuable feedback which will help inform our business activities.

## Community investment

We are proud to contribute to the NT's vibrancy and economic resilience by working with local organisations to deliver vital programs and services in the areas of education, training, health and wellbeing. In 2023 highlights included the expansion of existing partnerships with Starlight Children's Foundation, Foodbank NT's School Breakfast Program, and Darwin Festival – as well as new investments to support Darwin Basketball Association, Stars Foundation and Anglicare NT's Safe Hangout for All Kids (SHAK) youth drop-in centre.

INPEX is part of the Darwin community. We will continue to support and engage with the communities we work alongside and live in, through our long-term partnerships. We are proud of our people's energy to make the Territory a great place to be – and together, we are contributing to a brighter future. Thank you for your ongoing support.

# Results from the Community Perception survey

Across a 12-week period in 2023, an independent consultancy firm, on behalf of INPEX, undertook 39 face-to-face interviews with government, peak industry associations, local businesses, and community stakeholders to gauge sentiment and overall awareness of INPEX and the INPEX Ichthys Project in the NT.

The survey campaign also generated 184 responses from the general public via a digital survey and 26 responses from individual businesses at a business networking event hosted by Chamber of Commerce NT.

Below are some of the key findings of the Community Perception survey across a range of stakeholder groups.

## Value Perception



56% of all respondents **Agree or Strongly Agree** that INPEX is a **trusted organisation**.



60% of all respondents **Agree or Strongly Agree** that INPEX **creates value for communities**.



53% of all respondents **Agree or Strongly Agree** that INPEX has a **strong presence in the community**.



69% of face-to-face respondents **Strongly Agree** that INPEX **contributes** to the **Northern Territory's economy**.



30% of all respondents **Disagree or Strongly Disagree** that INPEX **business information is readily available and accessible**.

### Production Technician trainee career milestones

In early 2023, nine INPEX trainees celebrated an exciting career milestone as newly qualified Production Technicians.

The two-year traineeship program, delivered by Programmed Skilled Workforce, combines on-the-job and classroom-based training, during which participants gain a Certificate II and III in Process Plant Operations, as well as other important training including emergency response, high-risk licensing, first aid, and a suite of safety training courses.

Newly qualified Production Technician, Bruce Jarmin, expressed his gratitude to the Larrakia Development Corporation (LDC) for providing an entry point to the energy industry and is looking forward to progressing his career with INPEX.

“LDC provided a pathway to my life-long goal, which I am proud to have achieved through my own hard work and commitment.”

“At the end of the day, it’s not about what I have accomplished, it’s about who I may have inspired. I hope my journey will encourage other Indigenous people to step out of their comfort zone like I did,” Bruce said.

Since 2015, 12 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples have successfully completed their Production Technician traineeships, equating to 34% of INPEX’s overall trainee cohort of 35.

During the expo, INPEX team members discussed employment pathways with community members, shared virtual tours of the onshore and offshore facilities through VR headsets, and gifted AFL merch – donated by Gold Coast Suns – to students with the highest school attendance.

Year upon year, the event continues to grow with more employer stalls, government representation and community participation. INPEX is pleased to support the Ramingining careers expo, helping to empower generations and enhance the social and economic benefits of remote communities.

## Royal Flying Doctor Service

The Royal Flying Doctor Service (RFDS) provides urgent healthcare services to remote communities – services which are often taken for granted in metro areas.

INPEX proudly supports RFDS, backing its efforts to provide free community services including emergency evacuations from remote communities and cattle stations.

With a fleet of 80 aircraft across 23 bases throughout Australia, including one in Darwin and Alice Springs, RFDS responds to emergencies in the Territory every 20 minutes.

Health staff stationed on INPEX's two offshore Ichthys LNG production facilities, 240 kilometres off the coast from Broome, are supported by four RFDS members in Darwin and four in Western Australia.

“RFDS has provided essential primary healthcare services on our Ichthys LNG facilities, both onshore and offshore, for several years,” INPEX HSE Manager – Support, David Robotham said.

“Over the years, RFDS has expanded its services to encompass primary health care and preventative measures and, more recently, INPEX and RFDS have started to explore other initiatives to support the NT community,” David said.

We look forward to many more years of partnership with RFDS, supporting the mission of helping Australians live healthier and happier lives.

As a proud Gamilaroi woman, Lindsay has had an impressive career journey which has taken her from carpentry to electrical work, with a focus on instrumentation and control. Supporting the community is a high priority for Lindsay. From volunteering for the Girls Academy to mentoring children on the Tiwi Islands, her knowledge sharing helps younger generations build confidence and self-esteem.

Alongside her natural mentoring abilities, Lindsay's technical talent led to her promotion to a Work Execution Lead role in the 2022 Ichthys LNG maintenance shutdown making her the first female to hold such a position in the field.

## Foodbank in the NT – Christmas food drive

Foodbank was founded with a vision to achieve zero hunger.

As the primary provider of food and grocery relief in the NT, Foodbank SA & NT relies solely on donations and the generosity of others to help feed those in need – both during times of crisis and consistently throughout the year.

The INPEX-led Ichthys Joint Venture has been a proud supporter of Foodbank SA & NT for a number of years and is pleased to continue to support the School Breakfast Program across the Territory into 2024.

Aiming to combat hunger and increase school attendance, the School Breakfast Program provides a free daily breakfast to students in participating schools, currently operating in around 40 schools across the Territory.

In December 2023, representatives from INPEX's Darwin team, as well as members from INPEX's offices in Perth, Norway and Japan, were very pleased to support the Foodbank SA & NT Christmas food drive. After hitting the local Coles and filling several trolleys to the brim, items were donated to Foodbank's warehouse in Berimah where they were distributed to those doing it tough at Christmas.

## Starlight Children's Foundation Express Room brightens days

In 2023, INPEX was delighted to continue its partnership with Starlight Children's Foundation to support the operation of the Starlight Express Room at Royal Darwin Hospital and expand support to now include the Healthier Futures Initiative (HFI) operating across the NT.

The Starlight Express Room is the only treatment-free space in the hospital for children and their families to access a range of facilities and recreational activities, socialise and enjoy time away from the stress of the wards during their stay in hospital.

The HFI, funded by the INPEX-led Ichthys Joint Venture, facilitates the presence of Captain Starlight at mobile health clinics (in remote NT communities) to promote attendance of children and their families during routine check-ups, helping kids feel less anxious about medical visits and making clinics a positive experience. In turn, this leads to improved appointment attendance, meaning more kids get their vital health checks and treatments for improved long-term health and wellbeing.

## Partnering with Anglicare NT's SHAK youth hub in Darwin

Anglicare NT's Safe Hangout for All Kids (SHAK) youth hub, operating at Sanderson Middle School, offers a safe and supportive space for Darwin's young people to spend time outside of school hours. The SHAK provides access to activities, services and meaningful programs that support resilience, self-determination, and social and emotional wellbeing.

Operated by Australian Red Cross for 20 years, service delivery of the SHAK transitioned to Anglicare NT in collaboration with CAAPS Aboriginal Corporation in August 2023. The INPEX-led Ichthys Joint Venture has been a proud supporter of the SHAK youth hub since 2015.

"We are thrilled about the new partnership with INPEX. This enables us to expand activities offered at the SHAK and provide career pathways for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young people," said Craig Kelly, CEO of Anglicare NT.

Specifically, by contributing to this program, we hope to increase the capacity of the SHAK to achieve the following:

- Provide employment and trainee pathways for local young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.
- Provide increased trauma-informed training and professional development opportunities for SHAK staff.
- Support increased delivery of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultural activities by local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and businesses.
- Provide additional activities for young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples to improve health and wellbeing and increase engagement in education/training/skills development.

## Stars Foundation

On behalf of the INPEX-led Ichthys Joint Venture, we are pleased to highlight our new community partnership with Stars Foundation (Stars), which aims to support female Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students to remain in school and actively engaged in education to finish Year 12.

The program also supports students' successful transition into further study or employment. Central to the program's success are culturally sensitive and empowering mentors who create a safe environment for students to develop positive self-esteem and essential life skills and unlock their full potential during impressionable years, ultimately preparing them for a brighter future with sustainable career pathways.

In 2022, Stars provided invaluable support to more than 2,400 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander girls across 43 school programs in the Northern Territory, Western Australia, Queensland, Victoria and South Australia. Stars also actively supported their 2021 high school graduates and Stars Alumni cohort. In 2023, Stars worked with around 3,000 students across 52 schools.

Since the program launch in 2015, Stars students have achieved an impressive school attendance record. In 2022, their school attendance rate of 80 per cent, outperformed Indigenous students not participating in the program (68 per cent). Additionally, the Year 12 completion rate for their students stood at an exceptional 91 per cent, in contrast to the national Year 12 completion rate for Indigenous students, which was 65 per cent.

We are very proud to partner with an organisation that positively impacts the lives of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander girls and looks forward to fostering and strengthening this relationship for years to come.

## Reaffirming our commitment to reconciliation

One of INPEX’s key highlights in 2023 was the launch of its Stretch Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) 2023-2025 – our third Stretch RAP and sixth RAP overall. Joined by special guests from government, industry, community partner organisations and employees, various celebratory launch events provided an opportunity to reflect on our RAP journey to date.

In Darwin, an event was hosted at the NT Parliament House where The Hon. Selena Uibo MLA, then NT Minister for Aboriginal Affairs spoke highly of INPEX’s approach to Reconciliation.

“INPEX has been a leader in utilising the RAP approach to mould relationships and positioning with First Nations peoples,” Minister Uibo said.

“Also crucial, are the Ichthys LNG environmental and greenhouse gas offsets programs in the NT. That includes implementation of the Savanna Fire Management Program, Aboriginal Ranger Grants Program and establishment of a Conservation Agreement Area. These programs create positive environmental, cultural and economic outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

“That is a deeply impressive, crystal clear and measurable list of targets.

“On the basis that past performance is a good measure of future success INPEX is now entering into a busy and rewarding three years,” Minister Uibo said.

In Perth, at the Epoch Café at Boola Bardip (WA Museum) The Hon. Dr Tony Buti MLA, Western Australian Minister for Aboriginal Affairs was also complimentary towards INPEX’s key commitments on employment, capacity building and environmental offset programs.

INPEX is proud of its RAP achievements to date yet recognises there is still more to do.

We’re excited to continue to build on our RAP deliverables and progress our vision for an Australia where Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples thrive through equitable participation in social and economic development.

## Sharing the Harbour safely

INPEX is committed to sharing Darwin Harbour safely with all recreational and commercial users.

Up to three liquefied natural gas (LNG) export carriers and one liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) carrier are received each week at the Ichthys LNG onshore processing facilities at Bladin Point. In addition, up to one condensate carrier is received each fortnight.

The Regional Harbourmaster has declared a marine safety zone restricting access around Bladin Point, including the product loading jetty, to ensure the safety of everyone on the water.
